[PROPOSED] JUDGMENT BY COURT					

This cause came before the Honorable Joseph Di Loreto, judge presiding in Department "H" of the above-entitled Court. The People of the State of California, acting by and through Thomas M. Reeves, City Prosecutor for the City of Long Beach, appearing as attorneys for plaintiff.

It appearing that defendant is a successful and under the fictitious name of DOE 1, and defendant West Side Longos having been regularly served with process, and having failed to appear or answer plaintiff's complaint filed on January 12, 2004, and default of said defendants having been duly entered, and whereas plaintiff has dismissed without prejudice all remaining fictitious DOE defendants, plaintiff's request for entry of default judgment and supporting evidence having been considered in lieu of oral testimony pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure, Section 585, the Court finds by clear and convincing evidence that (1) the West Side Longos (the "WSL") is a criminal street gang as defined in Penal Code, Section 186.22; (2) Defendant is a member of the WSL; (3) the conduct of the WSL and its members constitutes a public nuisance in the Target Area (a map of the Target area is altached as page 7 of this judgment); (3) the Target Area is adequately defined geographically and narrowly tailored to protect the community from the public nuisance created by defendant WSL and its members. The target area is bounded on the south by Pacific Coast Highway, on the north by Hill Street, on the east by the Long Beach Freeway, and on the west by the Terminal Island Freeway. The Target Area is located within the City of Long Beach in the County of Los Angeles.

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED THAT:

- 1. Defendant WSL, all members of the WSL, and all persons acting under, in concert with, for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in association with them or any of them, are presently and hereafter enjoined from engaging in or performing directly or indirectly, any of the following activities in the Target Area (a map of the Target area is attached as page 7 of this judgment):
- a. Standing, sitting, walking, driving, bicycling, or gathering or appearing anywhere in public view with any other known WSL gang member. This prohibition shall not apply when: (1) the association involves attending class or school business or (2) inside a church or religious service;

1	provided, however, that this prohibition against associating shall apply to all claims of travel to or					
2	from any of those locations;

4	b. Drinking alcoholic beverages, or being within ten feet of an open alcohol					
5	container, in public view or anyplace accessible to the public;
